A wheel has been the symbol of Rotary since our earliest days. The first design was made by Chicago Rotarian Montague Bear, an engraver who drew a simple wagon wheel, with a few lines to show dust and motion. The wheel was said to illustrate "Civilization and Movement." Most of the early clubs had some form of wagon wheel on their publications and letterheads. Finally, in 1992, it was decided that all Rotary clubs should adopt a single design as the exclusive emblem of Rotarians. Thus, in 1923, the present gear wheel with 24 cogs and six spokes was adopted by the "Rotary International Association." A group of engineers advised that the gear wheel was mechanically unsound and would not work without a "Keyway" in the center of the gear to attach it to a power shaft. So, in 1923 the Keyway was added and the design which we know was formally adopted was the official Rotary International emblem.

### THE FOUR FOUNDING FATHERS OF ROTARY

Paul P. Harris (1868-1947) Was a Chicago attorney in 1905 when he had an idea for a club in which professionals and businessmen could share "mutual cooperation and informal friendship such as all had once known in our villages." On the evening of Thursday, 23 February 1905, Paul Harris gathered three business acquaintances to form a group that became the Rotary Club of Chicago, initiating the world's first service organization. Though Paul Harris was the visionary of such a club, he voluntarily did not become its head but later on the people under the banner of the organiztion made him the first President of What later named as Rotary International, the association of Rotary clubs around the world with more than 1.2 million members united under the motto "Service Above Self".

Silvester Schiele (1868-1945) was a coal dealer and a client of Paul Harris in 1905. Born in rural Indiana, Schiele liked to tell harris interesting anecdotes of his "young pioneer" boyhood. During the course of their business dealings, Harris first shared the idea with schiele for a new kind of club for professionals. On 23 February 1905, Harris invited Schiele for dinner to develop his ideas of a fellowship and booster club. In addition to becoming first president of the Rotary Club of Chicago, Schiele developed a close lifelong friendship with Harris.

Gustavus H. "Gus" Loehr (1964-1918) was a Chicago mining engineer who lent his office on the seventh floor of the Unity building at 127 Dearborn Street in Chicago for the first gathering of the founders of Ritary on 23 February 1905. Loehr invited Hiram Shorey to this meeting. His health later deteriorated and he left the club, but remained a supporter of Rotary until his death at the age of 53.

Hiram E. Shorey (1862-1944) was merchant tailor in 1905. One of the founding four members of the Rotary Club of Chicago, he remained a Rotarian for only a short time before moving back to his home state of maine. Upon his later return to Chicago, he rejoined for a brief membership, Shorey was always supportive of the Rotary Club of Chicago and voiced pride at his early association with Rotary.

### THE VISION OF THE ROTARY FOUNDATION



ARCH C KLUMPH RI President 1917-1918

Arch C. Klumph, the sixth President of Rotary International (1916-17) had a great vision of the future of Rotary as a "movement for the centures." but he realized that it would thrive only if it could sustain itself. It was at the Atlanta Convention in 1917 that he reiterated his plea for "an endowment fund for Rotary for the purpose of doing good to the world" and created The Rotary Foundation (TRF). The first steps in the Foundation's long march were feeble and there were doubts about its future during the depression years of the 1930s and World War II.


What triggered the infusion of life into the TRF was the desire of Rotarians to do something in memory of Rotary's founder, Paul P Harris, following his death in 1947. They started making contributions as paul Harris Fellows (PHFs), paul Harris Sustaining Members (PHSMs) and subsequently remained as Rotary Foundation Sustaining Member (RFSM). It was not long before TRF gained vigour and a firm footing primarily through Rotarians contributions and, later on, donations from other like-minded organizations.

The Foundation's permanent fund is so invested and managed as to yield substantial income to bear its administrative and fundraising costs as well as the surging cost of its numerous programs, which have steadily expanded over the years.

The man who foresaw the role of the TRF in Rotary's future, Arch C. Klumph, was a man of extraordinary energy whose devotion to the cause of Rotary was unparallel. Rising from boyhood poverty to outstanding success as a businessman in Cleveland Ohio, USA, Arch C. Klumph was also an active civic leader, accomplished flutist (he was a member of the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra for 14 years) and sportsman. He was Chirman of the Committee entrusted to write a new constitution for Rotary International and also wrote the Standard Constitution and Bylaws for all Rotary Clubs, adopted in 1915. His work provided the cohesive unity necessary for Rotary's growth.

Arch C Klumph died in 1952, by which time the Rotary Foundation's future was assured and it was "doing good to the world" just as Klumph had envisioned.





### RI PRESIDENT 2018-19 Barry Rassin and Spouse

Barry Rassin, of the Rotary Club of East Nassau, New Providence, Bahamas, is the selection of the Nominating Committee for President of Rotary International for 2018-19. He will be declared the president-elect on 1 September if no challenging candidates have been suggested.

As president, Rassin aims to strengthen our public image and our use of digital tools to maximize Rotary's reach.

"Those who know what good Rotary clubs do will want to be a part of it, and we must find new models for membership that allow all interested in our mission to participate," he says. "With Rotary more in the public eye, we will attract more individuals who want to be part of and support a membership organization that accomplishes so much good around the world."

Rassin earned an MBA in health and hospital administration from the University of Florida and is

the first fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives in the Bahamas. He recently retired after 37 years as president of Doctors Hospital Health System, where he continues to serve as an adviser. He is a lifetime member of the American Hospital Association and has served on several boards, including the Quality Council of the Bahamas, Health Education Council, and Employer's Confederation.


A Rotarian since 1980, Rassin has served Rotary as director and is vice chair of The Rotary Foundation Board of Trustees. He was an RI training leader and the aide to 2015-16 RI President K.R. Ravindran.

Rassin received Rotary's highest honor, the Service Above Self Award, as well as other humanitarian awards for his work leading Rotary's relief efforts in Haiti after the 2010 earthquake there. He and his wife, Esther, are Major Donors and Benefactors of The Rotary Foundation.

Rassin's nomination follows Sam F. Owori's death in July, just two weeks into his term as Rotary International president-elect.



# WHY ROTARY CARES FOR PEACE AND CONFLICT RESOLUTION

Rotary is dedicated to six areas of focus to build international relations, improve lives, and create a better world to support our peace efforts and end polio forever.

### **Promoting peace**

Rotary encourages conversations to foster understanding within and across cultures. We train adults and young leaders to prevent and mediate conflict and help refugees who have fled dangerous areas.

Conflict and violence displace millions of people each year. Half of those killed in conflict are children, and 90 percent are civilians. Sixty-five million people are currently displaced by armed conflict or persecution like in Myanmar of the Rohingya refugees, Syria, and elsewhere.

One of the primary focus of Rotary for over a century has been peace and conflict resolution in the world. Over the last one hundred years, the world has seen a lot of conflicts, including two World Wars. Rotarians and the Rotary family throughout the world have been waging peace in our communities instead. The birthday of Rotary – 23rd February – is known to usher world understanding and peace. In recent times Rotary has launched its new six areas of focus and one of those six areas is peace and conflict resolution. Hence, Rotary and peace are intertwined for a very long period of time.

The Rotary Peace Centres are one way of The Rotary Foundation (TRF) of Rotary International to do good for the world. In 1914 at Houston, delegates at the RI Convention passed a resolution to convene an

international peace conference. In 1921 in Edinburgh, the Fourth Object of Rotary defining peace was included. It was later ratified in 1922. In San Francisco in 1945, while chartering of the United Nations, several Rotarians made significant contributions in the drafting of the UN Charter providing the framework of a peaceful post World War II. To this day, this relationship between Rotary and the UN continues, and senior Rotary leaders are given observer status at the UN General Assembly each year in September.

The Rotary Peace Centers programme was established in 2002 to honour Paul Harris on the 50th anniversary of his death. The programme has a vision of creating sustainable peace, by building networks of peace builders and community leaders dedicated to preventing and resolving global conflicts. This number of peace-builders and community leaders is steadily increasing! One hundred peace fellowships are offered each year at Rotary Peace Centres around the world. To this day, 1000+ students have graduated from Rotary's Peace Centres programme.

The Rotary Peace fellowship is quite generous and comprehensive. The fellowship funding includes tuition, room and board, travel, applied field experience as well as conference funding.

To serve this vision, Rotary has developed unique partnerships with 7 leading universities who host our Rotary Peace Centers. The goal of the centers is to empower, educate, and increase the capacity of peace-builders through rigorous academic training, practice, and global networking opportunities. And the fellowship helps fellows build the skills needed to act as leaders and catalysts for peace and conflict resolution in their communities and across the globe. Alumni of





the programme that are working in the field of peace and conflict resolution and prevention provide us with resources for supporting the programme and future applicants.

Rotary has raised over \$156 million to support Rotary's peace initiatives. You can too by supporting Rotary's peace programmes through your generous contribution to TRF.

Rotarians Wage Peace: Rotary refuses to accept conflict as a way of life. Rotary projects provide training that fosters understanding and provides communities with the skills to resolve conflicts.

# SERVICES ABOVE SERVICE SHOULD BE RECOGNIZED

Service providing authorities around the world face a common set of challenges, whether their services are to meet the increased expectations of their 'customers' – the recipients are both citizens and businesses. One common challenge faced by the service providing individual or organization is how to service its citizen better.

In a country like Bangladesh, the public sector is a major service provider and traditionally government agencies are vehicle to provide services to the common citizen although various services are transferring to the private sector. The citizens/businesses expect due services from both public and private providers against payment of tax and price of services. It is expected that the service providers must find ways of improving the efficiency and effectiveness of its service delivery. This means providing value for money by improving quality of service and make access to service for all in a fair and equitable manners. There should be a continuous endeavor to reduce the cost of services.

In Bangladesh political authority happy with the revenue department for higher tax collection and happy with police department with the amount of fine and penalty imposed and collected by traffic police from the vehicle owners and drivers. Such news also get priority in the media as well.

There is hardly any link with expenses of services and delivery to the citizens. It is said that 'The reality of the public sector today is that it is assessed by the efficiency of its service delivery. The key principles fundamental to good governance are: a clear focus on the organization's purpose and outcomes for service users clarity about roles and functions managing risk and transparent decision making engaging with key stakeholders ensuring accountability.

The service providers must improve and aspire to discover, distil and disseminate evidence of 'what really works' to promote effective, efficient and equitable services. Every staff member has responsibility for providing good quality social care. Social care governance is the process by which organizations ensure good service delivery and promote good outcomes for people who use services.

Many countries have undertaken public sector reforms and more regulation to improve the quality of service delivery. The service provide may promote evidence on how best to create and sustain excellence in public service, support innovation and reform, and convene events that encourage new ways of tackling reform. An increasing number of governments are or envisage using design approaches to innovate and co-create public policy interventions with professionals, the private sector, civil society representatives, third sector organizations and citizens. In design thinking, stakeholders are called upon to play a responsible, active and constructive role in shaping decisions.

There are seven key areas of improvement are (1) speed - The time taken to deliver a service should be the shortest possible for both the customer and the organization delivering the service, right first time, (2) engagement - The manner in which services are delivered should be seen as customer-centric (i.e. participatory and trustworthy with the customer's needs at the core), (3) responsive - There should be an 'intelligent' mechanism in place to address any variation in meeting service levels and to drive changes in the service delivery organization, (4) value - The customer needs to believe that the service delivery mechanism is cost effective, and value is driven by customer outcomes, not organisational processes, (5) integration – The service delivery mechanism should be integrated. There should be no 'wrong door' policy for the customer, (6) choice – There should be multiple



channels for service delivery, so that customers can have 'channels of choice', depending on specific needs at specific times, (7) experience - Personalisation of service is necessary to ensure that customers' experiences are on a par with what they are used to receiving from the public and private sector.

There are different levels of service: poor, acceptable, normal, good, great and excellent service. Many countries have created rules, describe ways and prescribe a magical formula when it comes to delivering service. Some go the way of reliable, timely, personalized, memorable. unnoticeable. remarkable and so on. There are theoretical problems of validity, reliability, efficacy, and ethicality – as well as numerous others.

Service is the extent to which a service meets the customer's needs and expectations. The trouble is that they all focus on how it is delivered - the internal processes – or on the service itself. But that misses the point of service excellence and of service in general. Excellence theory is perhaps the most critical and dominant paradigm in understanding of public relations theory and practice.

The excellent service is when these experiences are surpassed and when customers feel that they have received that little unexpected extra in the shape of extra effort.

Sometimes that little unexpected extra can come in different shapes and forms such as a smile, a positive remark, random acts of kindness or the additional effort by a service professional going the extra mile.

The service providers get their salary and other benefits for their standard service to the receipients. They are also additional remuneration of early promotion and incentives from the government as their own standard assessments.

Some organization like Rotary and Lion clubs also recognizes the service providers with befitting manners. The Rotary Vocational Service Excellence Award is designed to recognize an individual who surpasses expectations for exemplary vocational service. These are employees of different public service proving organizations, who demonstrate one or more of the following attributes: (1) goes above and beyond to serve others with a positive and willing spirit, (2) demonstrated leadership or an ability to motivate others in pursuit of excellence, (3) considered situations and problems from novel and diverse

perspectives; addressed challenges in an innovative manner.The objects of Rotary do not include winning or awarding prizes or awards. It is about recognition for dedication, effort and making a difference: dedication to the ideal of Service Above Self. It recognizes the effort that members of Rotary Clubs expend to make a difference in their local or international communities; and making a difference by producing an investment in the future.Rotary follows the policy that service should be recognised and not only reward. Rotary clubs also have their internal recognition of members with award of 'Service Above Self'.

One of the global best known recognition is the Victoria Cross (VC). It is like the 'Bir Sharsto' of Bangladesh Army. It is the highest award of the United Kingdom's honours system. It is awarded for "gallantryin the presence of the enemy" to members of the British armed forces. It may be awarded posthumously. The Victoria Cross is awarded formost conspicuous bravery, or some daring or pre-eminent act of velour or self-sacrifice, or extreme devotion to duty in the presence of the enemy.It is said that the VC awardees are usually soldiers and take risk of their life to fight enemies with unusual manner and his army own the battle dramatically due to his supreme sacrifice.

A few years back during the earth quake in Bangladesh, all the doctors, nurses, other staffs and even patients left the hospital for own safety except one nurse. It happened in Panchagor district town. The nurse, Razia did not leave a new born baby and the mother after caesarian operation. The great lady had shown excellence of service beyond her professional duty. She may be a Night Angle of Bangladesh.

In another incident, a minor boy 'Jihad' fall into the pipe while playing at Khilgaon area. The fire service department could not rescue the boy alive or dead and abandon the operation. The cost of operation was few Crs of taka. But a simple handmade tool made by three volunteers eventually succeeded to bring him out, though it was too late. The tool instantly designed was made by them on the spot. The miracle operation of these common people was led by Faruk, a vehicle mechanic, Rahul, an engineering student and Moon, a diploma engineer.

The service providers are duly paid for their service and the social service organizations and government should come forward to recognize the excellence of services beyond the 'responsibility' and 'paid for' to encourage others to provide service about self for mankind.

Homeopathy is the treatment of disease with a highly diluted substance that is able to provoke similar signs and symptoms in a healthy body (treatment by similar). It's a branch of medicine based on the principle that "like cures like". Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery is an Undergraduate Academic Degree awarded for a course or program in the field of Homoeopathy. It is also known as B.H.M.S. (Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery). The duration of B.H.M.S. is normally five years. The internship shall be undertaken at the hospital attached to the College after the completion of the five year professional BHMS course. The period of internship is one year. This course is conducted by the DHAKA UNIVERSITY. Bachelor of Homoeopathic Medicine and Surgery degree as a holistic alternative medicine degree provides basic and in depth knowledge on Homoeopathic system of medicine.

# Symptoms Of Different Homoeopathic Medicine In Specific Disease

### **Psoriasis**

Psoriasis is one of the most chronic skin diseases that are characterized by thick, red, silvery, scaled patches on the skin. It can also be defined as an inflammatory skin condition. It affects both sexes and usually appears in the age of 15–30 years. It is rarely found in infants and

elderly people. It is not contagious and is caused by faulty signals in the immune system.

### Homoeopathic remedies for Psoriasis

NATRUM MUR:- Homoeopathic medicine Natrum Mur is the leading remedy for treating cases of guttate psoriasis. The patient suffers from dry psoriatic patches mostly in the scalp, hairy margin, behind the ears, bends of joints and most of the exposed areas of skin. The lesions are dry and the skin peels easily. People needing Natrum Mur may exhibit an unusual craving for salt and salty things. This usually aggravates the itching. The persons may also experience an increase in the symptoms when they go to a hot, humid climate as found in coastal regions.

ARS IOD:- Ars lod is also an excellent homoeopathic medicine for curing cases of guttate psoriasis characterized by an extremely dry skin which peels off easily. The patient may be very weak. Ars lod promises relief from guttate psoriasis in people who also have respiratory complaints. The skin shows excessive scaling. As the skin peels, the underlying skin is exposed and there may be a thin watery discharge. Ars lod can be prescribed to patients who are thin, emaciated and easily fatigued. They may also have profuse sweating at night.

SILICEA:- I find Silicea is another homoeopathic medicine which works well for guttate psoriasis. It is best prescribed for patients who have lesions that are tiny and look rosy red in color. As the lesions become old, the color changes to dark brown and then form into dry and white scales. Persons who require silicea may give off an offensive foot sweat. Silicea can be given in people who feel extremely cold and cannot tolerate even the mildest form of cold. The skin lesions may itch only in the day time and the patients feel better in the evening and night.

**GRAPHITES:-** I would pick homoeopathic medicine Graphites for treating skin ailments, especially in patients who may have a tendency to take cold easily. Graphites may be recommended for patients who are shy, timid and indecisive. The skin is rough and hard. Graphites can also be given in psoriasis of the nails where the nails are crippled and break easily. Nails are deformed and there may be cracks around the finger tips. In these cases, guttate psoriasis with lesions spreads all over the body.

### **VIRAL WARTS**

**Thujaoccidentalis:**— is the remedy of choice when the warts are cauliflower-like in shape, occur in crops, are moist to touch and bleed easily. These warts appear chiefly on the back of the head.

**Causticum:** - is effective when the warts are solid, flat on the surface of the neck, face, eyelids, and tip of nose and on the fingers. One dose every week, for three weeks, need to be administered.

**Calcareacarbonica**:- is indicated when warts are itching, bleed easily and soft and spongy and have a stinging sensation. One dose every week should be taken and this continued for two weeks.

**Dulcamara**:- is useful when warts are on the back of hands, large in size, fleshy and smooth to touch. One dose should be taken per week for three weeks.

**Ferrumpicricum:** - efficiently heals warts which appear on the palms and are painful, or occur on the soles of feet and are known as corns, and are yellow in color. The medicine should be taken three times a day for two weeks.

**Acidumnitricum:** - is to be selected for pendunculated warts that bleed easily, are painful and large in size. Every week for three weeks one dose is to be taken.

**Antimonium:** is indicated in cases of hard warts accompanied by the formation of a callus. One dose is to be taken every 12 hours for three weeks.

**Natrum carbonicum:** - is the remedy that is used in case of weeping, ulcerated warts occurring on the tips of the toes. One dose every 12 hours for three weeks is the prescribed dose.

**Natrum muriaticum:** - is indicated for warts that occur on palms having a propensity towards sweating. One dose every 12 hours is to be taken for three weeks or until the infestation is eliminated.

**Sepia:-** is the remedy of choice for large black warts that have hair growing from them.

It is advisable to consult an experienced homeopathy practitioner if the above medicines fail to improve your condition.



### Corn

Corns and calluses are thick, hardened layers of skin that develop when your skin tries to protect itself against friction and pressure. They most often develop on the feet and toes or hands and fingers. Corns and calluses can be unsightly.

### Homoeopathic remedies for Corn

**ANTIM. CRUD-** Corns inflamed, large horny placed on soles of feet close to the toes; thickened skin of soles & feet. Corn on soles & toes. Inflamed corn with great sensitiveness of soles on walking. Aching, stitching pains in corns. For children and young people inclined to grow fat; for the extremes of life. Old people with morning diarrhea, suddenly become constipated, or

**GRAPH-** Rough, hard, dry and unhealthy skin. Thin sticky, glutinous discharge. Soreness and aching in corns. Horny skin on toes. Suited to Excessive cautiousness; timid, hesitates; unable to decide about anything. Fidgety while sitting at work. Sad, despondent; music makes her weep; thinks of nothing but death.

**LYCOPODIUM-** Corns that are very sensitive with tearing pain. Skin becomes thick and indurated. Painful callosities on soles, toes and fingers contracted. Inflammation with stitching and soreness. For persons intellectually keen, but physically weak; upper part of

body emaciated, lower part semi-dropsical; predisposed to lung and hepatic affections; especially the extremes of life, children and old people. Deep-seated, progressive, chronic diseases. Pains: aching-pressure, drawing; chiefly right-sided, <. four to eight p.m. affects right side, or pain goes from right to left.

NAT. MUR- Corns, painful scars. Greasy skin. Boring, tearing and stitching pain. Worse walking and standing. For the anaemic and cachectic, whether from lots of vital fluids- profuse menses, seminal losses- or mental affections. Great emaciation; losing flesh while living well. Throat and neck of children emaciate rapidly during summer complaint. Great liability to take cold. Irritability: child cross when spoken to; crying from slightest cause; gets into a passion about trifles, especially when consoled with. Awkward, hasty, drops things from nervous weakness. Marked disposition to weep; sad weeping mood, without cause, but consolation from others <, her troubles.

SILICEA- Inflamed corns with stitching, burning pains. Soreness of soles. Stitches in the corns, jerking up the feet. Adapted to the nervous, irritable, sanguine temperament; persons of a psoric diathesis. Persons of light complexion; fine dry skin; pale face; weakly, with lax muscles. Constitutions which suffer from deficient nutrition, not because food is lacking in quality or quantity, but from imperfect assimilation; oversensitive, physically and mentally.
